I was impressed with the enjoyment he and his pet were having while 'out for a morning jog.' I reflected on the fact that happiness can be felt in many different ways. Why do all of us miss it so often? Many of us without the limitations of a wheelchair often go through life with a frown on our face which mirrors how we feel in our hearts. Most of us may not be confined to a wheelchair (although many are), and yet all too often our spirits are crippled by fears and worries that rob us of our joy. I couldn't help but whisper a prayer of thanks for the great 'snapshot of happiness' I saw as I drove along this morning. I pondered on whether the little pleasures of life still bring a smile to my face. And, by the way, I think I also saw a smile on the face of the dog! What is your face portraying today? Let the One who said He came to bring abundant life be the source of your happiness today!


