 Ecclesiastes 3:1*

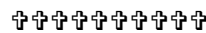

"Who do you think you are kidding?" is a question often asked by someone who feels they are being deceived in some way or another. Whether it is the politician who fails to live up to campaign promises or the person trying to talk you into buying an old broken-down car, it is wise to realize that deception permeates much of life. And how tragic it is when we see this age-old problem, which originated in the garden of Eden when Satan deceived Eve, surface even in the lives of Christians. There is nothing quite as sad and destructive as when a professing Christian leader 'pulls the wool over' unsuspecting, trusting church members. But wait. There is something even sadder and more destructive than these kinds of deception. What is it? James and John both mention it in their letters. It is self-deception...fooling ourselves into believing something that is not true! James says to watch for the *self-deception* of thinking it is sufficient if we simply *believe* the Bible, whether or not we put it into practice. (James 1:22). He also mentions that we are self-deceived when we 'think we are religious but fail to bridle our tongue.' (vs. 26). And John warns us to be on guard against the self-deception of thinking we have no sin to confess. (Jn. 1:8).

Some people who fall victim to deceivers may develop an attitude of distrust toward all people. This is unhealthy, of course. But it is wise to be on guard and distrustful of that Adamic nature that indwells each of us. It is always up to no good! Let's place our trust in the Only One who is trustworthy. Life will go much better!

## THE START OF A NEW YEAR IN THE CLEVELAND COUNTY

Listen! The sower went out to sow." Mark 4:3

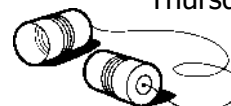

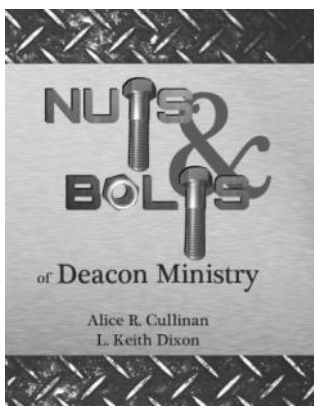
## **DEACON TRAINING BOOK**
