This has been an amazing summer, and I am so excited for all that God has done through our churches. We have received reports from our churches about VBS, here are the following numbers we gathered: 581 people volunteered, 724 children attended, and 21 children made first time professions of faith, and this was from just 13 churches that reported. If you haven't filled out the survey, please take time to do that, we want to give God the glory for the great things He has done this summer.

Our Indiana mission trip was also a wonderful time of serving alongside churches and church plants. I have heard reports of churches being encouraged by the work our mission team was able to accomplish. We were very busy hosting 6 block parties in 5 days, holding a sports camp, doing yard work/construction, and doing a VBS and day camp. The following is a testimony from one of the church planters we were able to help: "As a church planter, one of the things that proposed a challenge to our core group team was: How are we going to meet un-churched people? They are not going to just walk into our church services on any given Sunday. For the last two summers, what the churches from the GCCBA have helped us to do was create events and environments that would attract a crowd of people to a neutral environment. In the Summer of 2016, the block parties that the GCCBA put on introduced us to the community and them to us and we were able to add members to our core group prior to launching our church services. This summer the block parties and sports camps helped us to be introduced to dozens of families in a casual environment whereby we had a chance to invite them to our services. At this point, we do not have the people and resources to put on these high quality events, and the GCCBA has been integral in getting us off the ground. We are forever grateful. Thank you for your prayers and support of River Ridge Church in Jeffersonville, Indiana." ~ Patrick Lynch

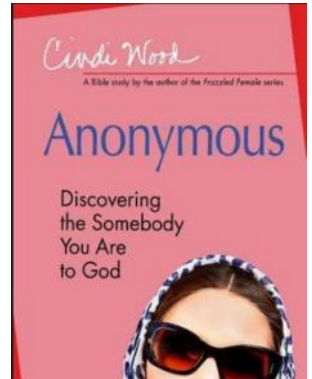

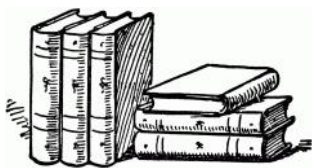

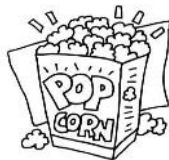
