We want to thank the Pleasant Hill Baptist Church, for their hospitality and willingness to host the Spring Bi-Annual Meeting of the Greater Cleveland County Baptist Association.

### Pleasant Hill Baptist Church

During the summer of 1850 under a roughly built brush arbor, Zoar Baptist Church of Shelby, NC extended an arm to the people of Pleasant Hill Community with a preaching ministry. As interest grew a building was decided on. Land was donated by Thomas H. Patterson. On February 7, 1851 Pleasant Hill was constituted and 29 members of Zoar became charter members of Pleasant Hill. Elder George R. Rollins was the first pastor. On April 17, 1851 Henderson Roberts, John Hamm and Clark Allen were elected deacons and Simon Putnam, Church Clerk. They were ordained on the 18<sup>th</sup> of July by Elder R. P. Logan.. Pleasant Hill had joined the Broad River Association and ask to be dismissed to join the newly formed Kings Mountain Association. Their first meeting was on November 7, 1851.

A second building was constructed in 1896 consisting of one room 36x54 feet. The building was used until 1929, when 10 rooms were added, plus wings to the old auditorium. The two structures were connected and the building was brick veneered. The present facilities consist of a 9,720 sq. ft. education building done in 1936 and the sanctuary adjoining area built in 1974 and 1975. Memorial Sunday was changed from first Sunday in May in 1975 until July to celebrate the new building. Mrs. Lizzie Dedmon, a former member, was recognized for painting the baptistery with a beautiful scene from the Holy Lane. She was ask to stand, and when she did, she ask all the people who were there that were related to her to also stand. At least half the people in the Church stood up.

The Civil War cost the Church at least 20 male members either killed, sickened or died including Deacon Clark Allen, killed at the Battle of Manasses, Virginia. In 1883 the Church had a membership of 247 and Sunday School of 50. Sunday School Superintendent was J. A. Roberts. A number of pastors served the Church during the years. In September 1943 Lawrence Roberts was called and was still there in May 1951when the Centennial was celebrated. On the back of the bulletin for the Centennial is a quote from a Circular Letter read at the Kings Mountain Association Meeting held at Pleasant Hill in 1859 by Elder Joe Suttle. "Dear Brothern for the sake of Christ, for the sake of the Church, for the sake of our Country, for the sake of your children and for your own sake, exhibit religion in your families, and in all your social movements."

The deacons who were elected to serve stayed until they died or resigned. This practice changed to a rotation system later. Pleasant Hill is also the Mother Church to three local Churches: Elizabeth Baptist founded June 8<sup>th</sup> 1883; Allen Memorial founded September 1946 and Putnam Memorial(now Pleasant City) founded October 1949.

Located at 2338 Pleasant Hill Church Road, Grover, North Carolina the Church, Cemetery and Parking let are located on a 7.29 acre track. The Church also owns a parsonage built in 1954. The land on which the Church stands was secured from Mr. William "Bud" Lowery in exchange For a parcel of the first lot that lay across the road. Land behind the Church was secured from the County Board of Education.

# 2018 Spring Business Affairs and Leadership Report

The Business Affairs and Leadership teams met on Tuesday, January 30 for a regular quarterly meeting. There were discussions about our finances and the need to educate churches about the work of the association. The association is dependent upon the gifts of the churches. Wesley will continue to develop relationships with pastors and churches in order to work together. We are continuing to pray for God's direction in building a new facility. Currently leadership does not feel God leading to move into that.

A report was given on the Pastor's Cohorts that begin in June of 2017. The first one is going great! It is scheduled to end this upcoming June. They are designed for one year. A new one has formed and will begin meeting in March.

Wesley reported that staff is in the process of adjusting to new responsibilities with the latest changes due to the retirements of Dr. Cullianan, and Charles Reed. Their new job titles and responsibilities were approved by teams, and stated in the new policy and procedure manual.

The Policy and Procedure Manual had not been updated in some time. Wesley presented the updated manual, and it was approved by the teams.

Wesley presented a proposal to change out the current fluorescent light bulbs at the office to LED's. Duke Energy has a rebate program going on that will pay for about 60% of cost of the new bulbs. This was approved.

The teams also approved for a new sign with our new logo to be installed.

Wesley recommend for the association to have an Associational Assessment performed by the state convention. The 2015 Vision Plan has almost been accomplished and it's time to prepare for the next three to five years. The teams agreed, and gave the Chair (Shane Kirby, Vice Chair (Dale Byrd), and Wesley permission to put together a Strategic Planning Team. Wesley asked for names of those who would be willing to serve. An assessment would be schedule for late summer, early fall.

Business Affairs and Leadership Teams met on Tuesday, April 10 for a regular quarterly meeting. The meeting opened up with great reports of what God is doing in churches! It was a wonderful time of sharing praise!

Wesley shared an update on the projects approved at the January meeting. The lighting was replaced and looks great! The new sign looks wonderful!

It continues to be a joy, privilege, and honor to serve as your Associational Missionary. The past two years have been great. I have really enjoyed getting to know our pastors and churches. I apologize that I have not made it into all of our churches yet. I have contacted all of our pastors and churches, in some way, but have not been able to visit in all of them just yet. That continues to be a goal of mine.

As part of our Revitalization Strategy, we started another Pastors Cohort in March. This makes two cohorts that we have going. Pastors are being encouraged and growing in the Lord. I pray this will enhance their ministry to you and our communities. We are praying about starting another one. Pray with us! The next step in the strategy is to share one of the books they are reading as a cohort with their church leaders.

I thoroughly enjoyed teaching our Spring Bible Study. We went through Henry and Richard Blackaby's book, "Flickering Lamps: Christ and His Church." We had a great time! I encourage you, if you can, to engage in this Bible Study time. Our Summer Study will be Tuesdays, beginning July 24 at 10:00am. Rev. Richard Stroup will be doing an overview of the Minor Prophets. I'm praying about the possibility of an evening study sometime for those who cannot attend the day time one. Be listening to hear more details!

The Business Affairs and Leadership Teams have been very helpful in getting some great things accomplished. Since our Fall Biannual Meeting, we have been able to adopt an updated Policy and Procedure Manual that will be very helpful in the day to day operations of the association, as well as with personnel matters. We have also been able to do a couple of things at the office that will help save with our utility costs. New Wi-Fi thermostats were installed for free by Duke Energy. They also gave us a credit per thermostat on our power bill each year! So it not only helps us control our temperatures better, but we also get money back. We were able to install new LED bulbs in our fluorescent fixtures, also. Duke Energy had a rebate on the bulbs which allowed us to get about 60% of the cost of bulbs back! The new LED bulbs are much brighter cleaner, and more energy efficient light. Come by and check it out! The teams also approved a new sign. We have been using our new logo for a little over a year now, and the letters on the current sign just looked old. So we had a new metal sign with our new logo installed on the brick that we have already. It looks great! Ride by and check it out.

Our staff is continuing to adjust to the new changes within our structure. Nicole, Katie, and Jose are working hard and adjusting well. We are still developing a new rhythm, in the absence of Charles and Alice. So continue to be patient with us as we work together. Katie, Nicole, and myself have many new responsibilities, but I love that we work well together as a team! The new job descriptions, responsibilities, and job titles are reflected in the new Policy and Procedure Manual. Please continue to pray for us as we adjust.

I'm very excited to report that we have fulfilled most of the 2015 Revisioning Plan. We are still praying about the new building and a church plant in one of the NAMB's Send Cities. The Business Affairs and Leadership Team approved a new Strategic Planning Team. You can see those names in that report. Please be in prayer for us as we move forward with this process. As a part of this process, we are set to have an Associational Assessment, August 29 and 30. We will need the participation of all of our pastors in this assessment. This will help us in planning for the next three to five years for the association. We want to be a resource that will help our churches become thriving, disciple making churches, reaching the lost in our communities! Our hope is to have a Strategic Plan to present to the association next spring.
