Fall Biannual Meeting

<u>Biannual Meeting Messengers</u> Bv-Law II Meetings, Section 3

Each church shall elect annually, in addition to the pastor, two (2) messengers to the meetings of the Association for each fifty (50) members of the church, provided each church shall not have fewer than three (3) nor more than ten (10) messengers. THESE ALONG WITH ALL ASSOCIATIONAL OFFICERS, shall constitute the voting body of the Association. The names of the messengers printed in the minutes shall include only those in attendance and registering at the Associational Meetings.

By-Law II Meetings, Section 4

Items of Business to be presented from the floor must be submitted in writing to the Associational Office at least 30 days prior to the first session of the Biannual Meeting.

Proposed By-Law Change (This will come in the Business Affairs and Leadership Report and voted on by the Messengers on Tuesday night.)

The Business Affairs and Leadership Teams recommend that the Association change the Association Year from October 1-September 30, to January 1-December 31 for both financial and leadership. This will mean that officers and team members would serve their terms from January 1 until December 31. They would be elected at the Fall Biannual Meeting, and begin their term of service on January 1.

Current Moderator, Vice Moderator, Clerk Treasurer, and Assistant Clerk Treasurer would serve an additional two months, until December 31.

BY-LAW IV Association Year (as currently stated)

The Association Year shall begin October 1 and close September 30.

BY-LAW IV Association Year (proposed change)

The Association Year shall begin January 1 and close December 31.

This would also change Section 2 and Section 3 of BY-LAW VI Officers and their elections.

Section 2 (as currently stated)

The Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Clerk Treasurer, and Assistant Clerk-Treasurer shall be nominated by the Enlistment Team. The floor will be opened for additional nominations. This election will occur on the last day of the October biannual meeting. All other officers shall be contacted and nominated by the Enlistment Team and elected during the April Biannual Session.

Section 2 (proposed change)

The Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Clerk Treasurer, and Assistant Clerk-Treasurer shall be nominated by the Enlistment Team. The floor will be opened for additional nominations. This election will occur on the last day of the October biannual meeting. These officers will begin their terms of service on January 1.

Section 3 (as currently state)

The newly elected Moderator, Vice Moderator, Clerk Treasurer, and Assistant Treasurer shall assume at the close of the annual session all duties incumbent upon them relating to work of the ensuing associational year. All other officers shall assume all duties incumbent upon them relating to the work of the ensuing year on October 1.

Section 3 (proposed change)

The newly elected Moderator, Vice Moderator, Clerk Treasurer, and Assistant Treasurer shall assume on January 1 all duties incumbent upon them relating to work of the associational year, along with all other officers.

Thoughts from our Staff.....

Over the past several months I've been writing about partnerships. We're excited about our 2018 Fall Biannual Meeting theme, "Partners For the Gospel." We invite everyone to come and fellowship and worship together, Monday October 29 at New Hope Baptist, and Tuesday, October 30 at First Baptist Grover, 6pm nightly for the fellowship meal. Worship begins at 6:55pm. Monday night we will hear from John Gordy, Strategy Coordinator the Baptist State Convention of North Carolina. He will be sharing with us about the Pockets of Lostness I shared about in last months article. Tuesday night we will hear some testimonies of church partnerships.

Over the next couple of months, I will be sharing what it looks like for your church to partner for the gospel. This month I'll share three ways your church can partner. These come from a breakout session that myself and Dr. Mark Millman led at the SBCAL (Southern Baptist Conference of Associational Leaders) in Dallas, TX, in June.

Three ways you can partner, or three ways partners can help you are:

1. Prayer

- a. Prayer is an underestimated value. You can agree to pray for a church, or ask a church to pray for you. Are you praying for other churches? Did you ask them how you can pray for them? Have you ever asked another church to pray for your church?
- b. "As for other matters, brothers and sisters, pray for us that the message of the Lord may spread rapidly and be honored, just as it was with you. And pray that we may be delivered from wicked and evil people, for not everyone has faith." 2 Thessalonians 3:1-2

2. People

- a. Sending people to help another church is a great way to create community among the body of Christ. Encouraging one another in Christ is a necessity.
- b. Allowing people to come and help you is not a sign of weakness, it is a sign of obedience. We are called to work together!
- c. "Therefore encourage one another and build each other up, just as in fact you are doing." 1 Thessalonians 5:11

3. Provisions

- a. Resources do not have to be money. They can be needed materials and ministry tools. Building materials, VBS materials, Literature, decorations, etc.
 - b. Money is sometimes helpful but not always.
- c. "Now about the collection for the Lord's people: Do what I told the Galatian churches to do. On the first day of every week, each one of you should set aside a sum of money in keeping with your income, saving it up, so that when I come no collections will have to be made. Then, when I arrive, I will give letters of introduction to the men you approve and send them with your gift to Jerusalem. If it seems advisable for me to go also, they will accompany me." 1 Corinthians 16:1-4

Next month I'll share how to develop partners.

HURRICANE FLORENCE

Stay awake, therefore firm in the freedom with which Christ has made us free, and not be subject to the yoke of slavery again. Galatians 5:1.

In life, we always experience hurricanes, many of them are very strong, category 4, and it is as if all the forces of nature have united together to damage, to destroy, to knock down large trees, to demolish large buildings, to invade walls, to destroy animal life and also human life; many times, I have meditated on the form of these natural phenomena and how they begin their lives in the most deep waters and away from

civilization. It is as if all them are formed on the seas. They begin their movements with speeds possible from 5, 10, 40, 80, 100, 120, 145, and more miles per hour. Their swells are spreading slowly, and their rains are moving more than 1000 km away from the eye. These rains are continuing, at times they are intense, at times moderate, but for me it is as if they are undermining the roots still in the trees and eroding the ground to soften it, and when the monster is coming with lightning, thunderstorms, winds of high speed and strength, all the things that once pretended that they are stable, they are well rooted, will move and many of them disappear to be swept away. All these forces together at times seem evil, they do not seem to be controlled by God, rather by the hand of Satan. Many of the hurricanes in our lives come also with many economic problems, health problems, and work problems. Nothing comes alone, and nothing that happens to man is also devoid of the eye viewfinder of God. You and I as servants must understand and accept that all storms are in the Almighty's control. No storm is bigger than our God. Paul, when writing to the Galatians, calls to them, saying that they are strong because in those days there were many false teachers and pastors who were putting heavy loads on new believers and wanted them to be the first Jews that had to be curtailed, and then to follow the Gospel. Paul defends his apostles and says, "you have been taught in the truth of the Gospel of grace, don't be fooled staying firm in the profession of faith that have been made, you were educated in the spirit of wisdom, do not allow the freedom that today have been obtained to be removed them, not again be subject to the ayoke of bondage of the law, which does not save, only in Christ is there salvation." For us, the Church of Jesus Christ must remain firm, solid, not mixed, without these new ideas that all worship the same God. No matter what religion it is, these ways of thinking, look beautiful but are like yeast; a little bit of it corrupts the mass. Don't be alarmed by the hurricanes that are coming straight for you. Stand firm, nobody is bigger than God, not even those category 4 hurricanes. Blessings.
