Merry Christmas!! What a wonderful time of the year to worship and praise the Lord! Christ has come! Immanuel, God with us!

We continue to think about and talk about partnerships. In our Fall Deacon Training, we talked about needing a "fishing" partner. In my October article, I shared with you three ways that your church can partner, Prayer, People and Provisions. In November's article, I shared about what we are partnering for, the Gospel. At our Fall Bi-Annual Meeting, you heard more about the "Pockets of Lostness," in Cleveland County and how we can "flip" a pocket.

This month, I want us to begin to think about the first way you can partner with churches, prayer. In all of Paul's Epistles, he begins with a word of thanksgiving, and in most of those instances, he mentioned how he was praying for recipient of the letter. Whether it was Timothy, Ephesus, Corinth, Colosse, Thessalonica, or Philippi. 1 Corinthians 1:4, Ephesians 1:16, Philippians 1:4, Colossians 1:9, 1 Thessalonians 1:2, 2 Timothy 1:3, Philemon 4, and in Romans 15:31, he asks them to pray for him. In Acts, the early church, "devoted themselves to the apostles teaching and to the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer." Acts 2:42

One of the greatest things you can commit to do is pray for a sister church. Send them encouraging notes letting them know you are praying for them. Our sister churches in Eastern North Carolina need some prayer and encouragement. Many of them were hit very hard by Hurricane Florence. I encourage you to pray for the churches in your community. The church in Acts prayed for boldness in Acts 4. After they prayed, the place where they were was shaken! Pray for the church to be bold in their witness for Jesus. Let the light of Jesus shine through you!

Thanksgiving Day

"For the Lord God is a sun and shield: the Lord will give grace and glory: no good thing will he withhold from them that walk uprightly. O Lord of hosts, blessed is the man that trusteth in thee." Psalm 84:11-12.

This month is of great importance for all who live in the United States.
