This is the third and final article on how to partner. Just to quickly review: The first two ways to partner with another church are Prayer and People. You can commit to pray for another church, or have another church pray for you. Sending people to help another church accomplish a specific ministry task is the second way. This can be viewed as working together also. Churches can have people come together to work on a specific ministry task.

The third and final way you can partner is with provisions. When people hear this term, they immediately think about money. It's no secret that it takes money to do ministry. Money can be very helpful and a great way to provide provision. However, provision doesn't always mean money. A church can share literature, furniture, or food for a food pantry or food outreach. Churches can provide music or Bible study material as well as paper or other goods that it takes to do ministry. Partnering with provisions doesn't just mean giving a church money. A great example of this is collecting food or paper products for a food pantry of a neighboring church.

Helping with provisions can be a great asset in a partnership. One thing I need to mention here is that the receiving church should not expect to depend on these provisions forever. The goal is to help a church get to a point where they can help partner with another church by helping provide as well. Teaching the congregation to give and not just receive is vital to church health. Partnering together by sharing resources or providing resources is an excellent way to partner. It's important to note that this is last on our list for a reason. Many small or normal size churches (I'll explain this term in another article) may feel like they can't partner due to limited resources themselves. That's simply not true. Prayer is the biggest way to partner. In Acts 4 we find that when the church prayed for boldness, the earth shook! Prayer is vital to the ministry of God's church. I believe prayer and relationships (people), are the two biggest and best ways to partner.

Are you partnering with another church to help minister to your community? Is there a need in your community that your church just can't meet on your own? Have you prayed for a partner? In order to accomplish God sized tasks, we must work together!

MISSION AND YOUR LIFE

"And he sent them to preach the kingdom of God, and to heal the sick." Luke 9:2.

Jesus chose and trained His disciples in a continuous manner. Mainly, He allowed them to observe the ministry He was developing. It followed, step by step, all the experiences of our King. All the time that they followed, they did not miss a single detail, teaching, preaching, visitation, or evangelization. A great deal of what was accomplished was people being healed. People were living in very poor conditions, medicine was scarce. There were also poor hygienic conditions, and food preparation was deplorable for the poorest families. But, Jesus made ready His servants and delegated power and authority to them over demons and diseases. Then, He gave them His blessing and sent them to fulfill the same mission that they had observed Him fulfilling. The same delegation is now in force. You and I have been chosen, prepared, and anointed the power of the Word to perform the same work. My question is now: Are you fulfilling the mission? Are you following in obedience? They were obedient and went to preach the Kingdom of God. In a parallel passage in Matthew 10, Christ tells His disciples that the land of the Samaritans and Gentiles were not the only lost sheep of the house of Israel. They were the beginning of the Good News of salvation. Today, we have made progress and have been released from choosing certain groups, race, and people. Today, the Gospel has no barriers; it is free, and it runs its course and crosses barriers. Thanks to the Lord of hosts, who removed the curtain of ignorance, that all people should come to repentance. So, you have a mission, the most important of your life. We cannot stand still and be silent. Your life and mine are in danger. We have been given a task. We have been called to a purpose. Christ's commands were not complicated, "Take nothing for the journey, neither staffs nor bag nor bread nor money; and do not have two tunics apiece. Whatever house you enter, stay there, and from there depart. And whoever will not receive you, when you go out of that city, shake off the very dust from your feet as a testimony against them. So they departed and went through the towns, preaching the gospel and healing everywhere." We have the orders, and yet we are waiting; it's like we're stuck, deeply bound, preventing us from fulfilling the mission. We need to be motivated. The apostles went out confident. They were dependent on those who harbored them, and they were not afraid. They traveled from family to family, village to village. Many homes despised the Word; but that did not stop them, they traveled on to fulfill the mission. We must do the same and follow their example. God bless your congregation and your life.
