Bi-Annual Meeting Messengers

By-Law II Meetings, Section 3: Each church shall elect annually, in addition to the pastor, two (2) messengers to the meetings of the Association for each fifty (50) members of the church, provided each church shall not have fewer than three (3) nor more than ten (10) messengers. THESE ALONG WITH ALL ASSOCIATIONAL OFFICERS, shall constitute the voting body of the Association. The names of the messengers printed in the minutes shall include only those in attendance and registering at the Associational Meetings.

By-Law II Meetings, Section 4: Items of Business to be presented from the floor must be submitted in writing to the Associational Office at least 30 days prior to the first session of the Biannual Meeting.

Thoughts from our Staff.....

Words from Wesley....

But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. 'Matthew 6:33

I am very excited about our annual meeting this month. It is wonderful to get together for worship and fellowship. We will be focusing on seeking first the kingdom of God! Monday night we will have Chuck Campbell with us. He's the Strategy Coordinator with the Baptist State Convention of North Carolina for the Unifour Area. He will be bringing our Monday evening message. Tuesday night we will have testimonies from three areas of ministry in our association. It will be a great time! Make plans to join us!

I've had several comments about the series of articles I did on Thom Rainer's, "Autopsy of a Deceased Church." Here's a reminder of the numbers he gives regarding the symptoms of churches.

- 10% are healthy
- 40% experience symptoms of sickness
- 40% are very sick
- 10% are dying

Keep in mind there are currently eighty three churches in our association. That means that an estimated

- 8.3 are healthy
- 33.2 are experiencing symptoms of sickness
- 33.2 are very sick
- 8.3 are dying

If you haven't already, go back and read what Rainer recommends for churches in each symptom area. Read his book! I did list those in the August Beacon, but read his comments on each one in his book. Another great resource that I have quoted before is "Reclaiming Glory," by Mark Clifton.

"What about a dying church brings glory to God?" - John Mark Clifton

You may read those and ask, how do I know if my church is dying? In episode 529 of Rainer's Podcast on Leadership, he gives **Seven Symptoms of a Dying Church**. You will need to listen to the podcast to get the discussion on each of these, but you may also figure out some from reading the list. Please keep in mind these are symptoms. A church may not experience all of these.

- 1. Continuous battles (When a church is in "fight mode, it is inwardly focused and likely not reaching people for Christ.)
- 2. Numerical declines of three or more years
- 3. Rooms as idols (Ownership of rooms for ministry or Sunday School. Room is big enough for 35 but they only have 4 and they will not move.)
- 4. Memorials and plaques (Certain things off limits because it was a gift)
- 5. Prolonged meetings (Meetings just for meetings, filling up time)
- 6. Deflection of blame (blame the pastor, blame the deacons, blame culture, blame anyone and everyone but accepting responsibility)
- 7. Methodological stability (comfortability, not wanting change)

I want to add that if you are one of the eight churches that are healthy, what are you doing to be in a position to help replant or revitalize a dying church? Are you developing leaders that can and are willing to step into replant and revitalize? I believe it's going to be churches that replant and revitalize dying churches. Pray for each other! We're in this together! If you are one of the eight that are dying, there is hope! You can live again, it will

just look different. To the sixty-six, sick churches, do you know you are sick? Admit it, confess, seek the Lord for wisdom. Be willing to make changes. Ask for help.

PAUL INTERCEDES FOR ONESIMUS.

In Central America, mainly in Nicaragua, this month is called the month of the Homeland, in which the men who fought for the independence of each nation in Central America. When studying this time period, courage, morality, and perseverance to see a free homeland, are all themes. Many large countries sought freedom from slavery. This was here in our lands, as well. Slavery is as old as the history of men. In Philemon, we find the story of a man named Paul who brings two servants to the feet of Jesus Christ. Paul also met a man named Onesimus, who was a slave of Philemon who had escaped him. Paul took him to the feet of Christ and instructed him to return to Philemon. Paul tells his brother Philemon to receive Onesimus, not as a slave, but rather as free, and that he will repay any damages. The letter is of vital importance because each and every one of us were slaves, we lived tied, we lived in ruins. But thanks be to God because one day Christ came and freed us from all those bonds, and today we are free to serve, to worship, and to serve by taking the seed of the Gospel to others who are still chained. Now Philemon is going to receive the one who was his slave, but now he is a free man by the power of the Word. Now the relationship between them will be different. Now Onesimus owes nothing to Philemon. Christ has settled the account of the two. He has done the same for us today. Today we have been released by the power of the blood of Jesus Christ.
