Words from Wesley...

"They replied, "Let us start rebuilding." So they began this good work." Nehemiah 2:18

My how quickly things have changed. No pun intended. In my article this month, we will continue our series of articles from Thom Rainer's book, "Who Moved My Pulpit?: Leading Change In The Church." If you haven't been following or would like to go back and read, you can see our archived copy online at our website, http://gccba.org/ newsletter/. We are continuing with the stages of Rainers, Road Map To Change. Let me remind to, this article or previous articles just hits the highlights. I would highly recommend you read the book in its entirety. I had hoped to finish the final four stages in this article, but there is too much. I'll hit the final two in next month's article. Let me also add that if you were working toward change prior to March 11, 2020 and that desired change hasn't happened yet, don't give up. Keep working. However, keep in mind that many things have changed recently and fast. You may consider moving slower and giving some time for the current changes to set in.

- 5. **Deal with People Issues-** The courage to handle people blockage, both staff and church. This component was very deep and had SEVERAL layers to it.
 - a. Love People- "If you love change more than you love people, you have already failed as a leader."
 - b. Expect Opposition- "...if you are a change leader, you will have to deal with critics and opposition."
 - c. Eager Coalition- having key leaders who will be a buffer between the church and the pastor.
 - d. Eating an Elephant- "How do you lead change at a church. One careful step at time." I would love to have room to print the percentages of change ratio, but I'll encourage you to read the book. It was helpful. Just keep in mind that 25% are resistant to change and 20% are highly resistant to change.
 - e. Not delaying people decisions- When having to make changes in staff or volunteer positions, don't delay. "If you know you have to make a difficult decision with someone, don't delay. The situation will only worsen."
 - f. Losses- Some will not be able to make the changes. Sadly, there will be
 - g. Ongoing Prayer- "Prayer should be the centerpiece of our lives as we lead people toward change."

Thoughts from our Staff.....

- 6. **Move from Inward Focus to Outward Focus-** "Over time the efforts of the church typically move inwardly." "Many churches move from a dynamic Great Commission body to a religious country club. The members pay their "dues," and you better make certain they are happy and well served." Rainer says that change will not happen without an intentional outward movement. He gives four action items for churches to move outwardly.
 - a. Outwardly Focused Leader- "Whether you are a pastor, elder, staff person or lay leader, you can't lead change without embodying change." How do you become a more outward focused leader? Rainer says it can be as simple as becoming accountable to someone for Great Commission behavior.
 - b. Outwardly Focused Budget- Look and see what money is used for in the church budget. Is it for the community, or for the church members?
 - c. Outwardly Focused Increments- Lead change incrementally to prepare church for the greater change.
 - d. Outwardly Focused and Low Hanging Fruit- "Think about major changes or change your church needs to make. What low-hanging fruit can you find that is a step toward those changes?" Make a "first step," toward desired change.


