Words from Wesley...

"There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens."

It has been exciting to see so many of you continue to find ways to minister in your communities. I know that it has been difficult for pastors and church leaders to make decisions with multiple convictions and opinions, but I pray that this has been a learning and growing season for you and your church. Many of you have found new ways to minister, structure and make decisions. We started the summer finishing up with change in the church. Change continues.

The writer of Ecclesiastes reminds of seasons. He shares a list of seasons, and in verse three, he says, "...a time to tear down and a time to build." In verse two, he mentions the seasons of birth and death, planting and uprooting. I believe this season for the church is a season of rebuilding, birthing and planting.

A great podcast for any church leader to listen to would be, Thom Rainer's podcast episode #627, "Understanding Church Disruption." Here are the points that he makes in the podcast about disruptions:

- Disruption, properly understood, can be a good thing.
- Many churches are declining and dying because they have not been disrupted.
- An older example of disruption: multi-site.
- A current example of disruption: churches partnering with businesses for revenue. (listen to this closely).
- Disruption is ultimately a change in leadership and has to be treated as such.

I believe the bigger issue is that many churches see the current situation as an interruption, not a disruption. Those who see this season as an interruption will be disappointed and discouraged. Carrie Nieuwhof, in his blog, "5 Predictions About the Future While Everything's Still Unknown," says this:

"It's pretty clear by now that the shuttering of business, churches and restrictions on movement and gatherings will be measured in months rather than weeks. It's also becoming far more likely that when things do re-open, it won't be an overnight return to wide-open gatherings and travel. To make things more challenging, the return to travel and gatherings the way they were might be measured in years, not months. Perhaps it will never be quite the same again."




School Prayer Opportunity
